2. Company Secretary

Ms Susan Crawford was appointed to the position of company secretary on 28 February 2017. She was appointed the Executive Director of the Foundation, and a director and the Chief Executive Officer of its wholly-owned subsidiary, PIEF RTO Services Limited (the RTO) on 31 January 2017.

3. Objectives and Strategies

The Foundation was incorporated on 24 January 2006.

As part of a strategic review the board endorsed a new vision, purpose and objectives as follows:

Our Purpose

The Foundation's purpose is to strengthen personal injury and disability management industry capability to deliver social and economic value and community outcomes.

Our Vision

The Foundation's Vision is to be recognised as the leading learning partner and provider of training and professional development programs, in the personal injury and disability management community.

Our Objectives

- To be known for building and strengthening industry capability and fostering innovation
- To provide education and professional development programs that are industry relevant, and address current and future state industry capability requirements and sustainability
- To have a membership base which is representative of clients they serve across every jurisdiction, scheme type, insurer and agent
- To be known for celebrating excellence and inspiring talent in the industry at an individual, team and organisation level
- To ensure that best practice is acknowledged, promoted and shared across the industry.

Strategy 2018-2021 sets out the following strategic priorities of focus for the next 3 years:

- 1. Enhance and maximise member value
- 2. Continue to engage learners and build capability
- 3. Continue to bring industry stakeholders together
- 4. Continue to build a sustainable & robust operating model

4. Principal Activity

Over the 2017/18 financial year, the Foundation's principal activity was the continued development, implementation and delivery of education programs and events designed for the personal injury management sector.

An environmental scan activity undertaken during the last quarter of the previous financial year (2016/17), identified significant changes to the industry on a national scale from both a legislative, regulatory and stakeholder perspective and impacting the Foundation's members. The changing environment implies that the industry is realigning focus, with potential implications for stakeholders of reshaping and resizing.

Technical and transactional skills, whilst necessary are now more and more recognised as not being sufficient in serving our community. As a result industry is putting increasing emphasis on greater person-centred focus for injured parties. This puts pressure on the capabilities of those employed in the industry to use a more evolved and complex capability and skill set toward enhanced requirements in conceptual and interpersonal capability. This has had and will continue to have an impact on the Foundation's education and professional development programs.

In addition the change in industry emphasis to a client centred approach means that industry members will need to utilise a different skill set to the traditional skill set. A greater emphasis on interpersonal or soft skills will be required to compliment the technical and conceptual capability.

In addition to the changing focus and shape of the personal injury management industry, the world of education and learning is changing. There is an increasing trend in education worldwide towards education that is flexible and open. Learning is being separated from certification, with many learners engaging in "just in time" learning and separating the certification process.

To remain relevant, PIEF programs must address the changes in the education and learning world by facilitating a broader and more current view of the skills and capability required in the personal injury management industry, together with a more flexible and blended delivery and student centred approach.

Consequently the Foundation reviewed its strategic plan and as a result embarked on a significant transformation program.

Concurrently with this transformation program and in preparation for the reregistration of the RTO a comprehensive program was undertaken to evaluate compliance and governance requirements. An external audit was commissioned in May 2017 to establish a baseline, with a follow up audit undertaken from May through to August 2018 to determine progress against the Australian Skills Quality Authority standards and requirements.

Customer engagement qualifications were added to the scope of registration for PIEF RTO Services Limited.

Specifically the Personal Injury Education Foundation and PIEF RTO Services Pty Ltd:

- Delivered, in conjunction with Griffith University, two postgraduate programs in personal injury management:
 - o Graduate Certificate in Personal Injury Management
 - o Master of Personal Injury Management
- Delivered and awarded the following qualifications through its RTO business:
 - o Diploma of Personal Injury Management
 - o Certificate IV in Personal Injury Management Claims Management stream
 - o Certificate IV in Personal Injury Management Return to Work stream
 - o Certificate III in Personal Injury Management
- Continued to deliver the Workers' Compensation Allied Health Practitioner on-line training program for the NSW State Insurance Regulatory Authority (SIRA) Workers Compensation. 1281 students completed the full program (Part 1, 2 and 3 of the program) in 2017/18 with a further 142 completing Part 3 only by 30 June 2018. This program has been designed for allied health practitioners who deliver services to workers compensation clients and invoice SIRA. It is a mandatory requirement for those seeking SIRA approval.
- Continued to deliver the Providing Allied Health Services in the NSW Motor Accidents CTP Scheme to 864 learners.
- In a joint venture with AMA Victoria, the Foundation was successful in winning the contract to develop and deliver the Impairment Assessment Training for Medical Practitioners. The

contract commenced on 22 February 2018 for a period 3 years with 2 x 3 year extension periods available.

- The Foundation, together with PIEF RTO Services Limited, was awarded the contract for the
 development and delivery of a Northern Territory Workers Compensation Injury Management
 e-learning program. After a lengthy consultation, design and development period, the program
 was launched on 14 March 2018, with 120 enrolments and 10 scholarships for Indigenous
 Australians.
- Following the development and delivery of a series of workshops for the National Disability Insurance Agency and Allied Health Professionals Australia in 2015/16, an online program was developed and delivered to 5264 participants from July to December 2017.
- Continued to deliver the ReturnToWorkSA Allied Health Practitioner online training program, designed for allied health practitioners working within the South Australian Workers' Compensation scheme with 667 enrolments.
- Partnered with a number of member organisations to develop and deliver tailored in-house programs resulting in Certificate III and Certificate IV in Personal Injury Management
- Developed and delivered a webinar series in conjunction with the Safety Institute Australia
- Significant preparation was undertaken for the 2018 National Personal Injury & Disability Management Conference
- Attended and sponsored a number of State and Territory industry conferences
- Prepared for the relocation to 1 Malop Street Geelong Victoria, with WorkSafe Victoria on 2 July 2018.

5. Review of Operations

Information on the operations and financial position of the Foundation and its business strategies is set out in section 3 "Objectives and Strategies" of this report.

The Foundation continued to streamline operations, undertaking a review of the entity structure, resulting in PIEF RTO Services Limited's application for registration with ACNC as a not for profit organisation being successful on 15 June 2018.

6. Significant Changes in the State of Affairs

An application to deregister the Injury and Disability Management Institute of New South Wales Limited (IDMI), a wholly owned subsidiary of the Personal Injury Education Foundation, was lodged with ASIC and subsequently deregistered on 19 August 2018.

There were no other significant changes in the state of affairs of the Group during the financial year.

7. Events Subsequent to Reporting Date

An application for the reregistration of PIEF RTO Services Limited was submitted in August 2018 to ASQA and approved for a further 7 years until the 24 November 2025.

No other matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Group, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Group in future financial years.

8. Likely Developments and Expected Results of Operations

There are no likely developments or foreshadowed developments that have not otherwise been disclosed in this report.

9. Environmental Regulation

The Group's operations are not subject to any significant environmental regulations under either Commonwealth or State legislation. However, the directors believe that the Group has adequate systems in place for the management of its environmental requirements and are not aware of any breach of those environmental requirements as they apply to the Group.
